### **Bar Exam Format**

The Pennsylvania bar exam is a two-day exam. Pennsylvania has adopted the Uniform Bar Exam (UBE).

**Day 1:** Six 30-minute Multistate Essay Exam (MEE) questions and two 90-minute Multistate Performance Test (MPT) questions.

Day 2: Multistate Bar Exam (MBE), a six-hour, 200-question multiple-choice exam.

## **Subjects Tested**

**Essay Examination:** Consists of six essay questions. Each question will include one or more of the following topics as they relate to Pennsylvania law. Not all topics may be tested.
