From the Director

I am very pleased to be sending you this newsletter. Its function is mostly to provide you with a directory of Center alumni/ae in hopes that you will keep in touch with former classmates or renew associations from when you were students here. Although we have tried to be as accurate as possible, should you find an error or if your information needs updating, please let Susan Katcher or me know.

With our holiday card, we sent each of you our most recent brochure. I am pleased to report updated information to you here. First, the Center was awarded a three-year grant from the United States Information Agency (USIA) for a Partnership Program with Far Eastern State University's Law Institute in Vladivostok. We will be working with FESU over the next three years in a mutual exchange of personnel whose focus will be on teaching international law topics as well as

enhancing the law library at FESU. The first FESU professor, Natalia Prisekina, was here in April; I am planning to visit Vladivostok in July; and Professor and Law Library Director Steve Barkan will survey the FESU library resources during the summer. JD student David Miller also will examine FESU's law curriculum for a portion of the summer.

The Center received a smaller grant from the University's Office of International Studies to assist in funding a one week study program that will be conducted at the University of Hokkaido in late May. Professor Ralph Cagle and I will be leading a group of JD students who will join Hokkaido students in a simulation course on cross-cultural negotiations taught by Professor Cagle.

The University grant will also help fund the Center's summer internship program with Thammasat University. For the third year, we plan to have two J.D. students go to Bangkok to take one week of classes on Thai law at Thammasat University, followed by a month of working at a law firm in Bangkok. All the students who have participated in this program have found it of great benefit to their legal education as well as broadening their understanding of their role as a future player in the world of international law.

Earlier this year, I was in Korea and Taiwan where I gave several lectures and was able to meet with many

of you. One of the highlights of my trips to East and Southeast Asia is seeing former students. It is a special pleasure for me to hear what you have been doing since you left Madison. I am pleased that many of you have continued to stay in contact with each other, in what I might call "local" alumni/ae clubs. I am happy to know that you remember the Center and the Law School and the University, and that you

appreciate the role that all three played in your advanced legal education.

Susan Katcher, the Center's Associate Director, recently attended an ABA (American Bar Association) Conference on Graduate Legal Education for Foreign Lawyers held at Duke University Law School. She told me that one of the speakers at the conference told of the need to have JD law students who were "bilingual, bilegal, and bicultural." His point was that the international master's students, rather than being a small group somewhat separate from the JD students, should be integrated much more into the social and academic

The Center has established a fund in memory of Jihan Park, MLI 1998, who sadly was killed with his wife Soom-Mi in an automobile accident in the summer of 1998 as they were on their way to tour the western United States. Jihan had just finished taking the New York Bar exam and had recently completed the coursework for his MLI degree at the time of his death. Their son survived the accident, and is now being taken care of by Jihan's family in Korea. The Center will send

contributions to the Park family in Korea to help in the costs associated in the raising of the child. The Center will collect money for the next three months, and then send all of it to Jihan's family at the end of the summer, 1999. If there are any contributions that are received after this time, we will, of course, also send those to Jihan's family.
