

Law School letter grade reported by instructor	Grade recorded on transcript if use Pass/Fail Option	Factored into your GPA?	Counts as one of your two Pass/Fail Options
B+, A-, A or A+	B+, A-, A, or A+	Yes	Yes
C, C+, B-, or B	S	No	Yes
F, D-, D, D+, or C-	F, D-, D, D+, or C-	Yes	Yes

Recorded grades are factored into the GPA and count as graded credits for The Order of the Coif & Dean's List eligibility

Apply to Graduate

- Apply to Graduate through your Student Center
 - Instructions: https://kb.wisc.edu/registrar/4128
 - The commencement ceremony referenced is @ Camp Randall
- Verify your name
 - https://registrar.wisc.edu/applyforgraduation/
 - scroll down for instructions & info on "legal name" vs. "name in use"
 - The University Registrar can add accents/diacritics to a degree name that will be used on the diploma. Email the University Registrar at registrar@em.wisc.edu. It must match your primary/legal name in the student record system.
- Verify your mailing address post-graduation; diplomas may be mailed as late as July





Diplomas are sent by the University Registrar

- Clear all holds
- Diplomas are sent to the address you enter when you "Apply to Graduate"
- Degree will appear on OFFICIAL transcript and diploma
 - Concentrations do not appear on transcript or diploma
- Conferral date will be May 12, 2024

Official UW transcript - obtained through University Registrar at https://registrar.wisc.edu/transcript/

- No charge for official transcripts
- You are responsible for sending your transcript to the BBE
- Official transcript includes degree conferral date & honors (Dean's List/Latin designations) but does not have Law School GPA
- Unofficial transcript through OCPD includes Law School GPA but does not confirm degree conferral date or list honors

Graduation Honors - appears on official transcript

- *May & August 2024 graduates:
- 3.45-3.69 cum laude
- 3.7-3.89 magna cum laude
- 3.9-4.3 summa cum laude

Dean's Academic Achievement Award - 3.45 & above

Order of the Coif

Top 10% of Dec 2023, May 2024, & Aug 2024 combined class *Must have 68 graded credits (last year's gpa was 3.66)

Class Standing Tables will be updated in June



Curricular Concentrations Student Handbook Section 2.2.5

- Different than certificates
- https://law.wisc.edu/academics/certificate-programs/ (this link goes to the Concentrations - Scroll down)
- Have you confirmed your courses with the faculty advisor?
- Fill out the form circulated via email (coming soon)
 - make sure your mailing address is one that will reach you in June/early July.
- If eligible for honors, indicate on the form





Diploma Privilege & Bar Information



Wisconsin Diploma Privilege Student Handbook Section 4.6

- Swearing-in: May 29 TWO guest limit
- Files MUST be deemed complete by May 10 to participate in swearing-in
- The WI Board of Bar Examiners (BBE) handout
- Final deadline for May 2024 graduates is July 1, 2024
- You are responsible for requesting your official transcript be sent to the BBE
- Call BBE with any questions: (608) 266-9760
- Deadline for August grads: Oct 1, 2024
- Deadlines for Dec grads: July 15 for discount; Feb 1 is final



Certifications for Bar Admission

Student Handbook Section 4.7-12

- Wisconsin Bar: The Law School submits the Dean's Certificate (confirmation of degree earned/complete). You do not need to request this certification.
- U.S. District Court for the Western District of WI: Complete online application by Friday, May 24: https://www.wiwd.uscourts.gov/attorney-admissions
 - This swearing-in takes place after the BBE and you must participate in the BBE swearing-in to be sworn in the Western District
- States other than Wisconsin: All Character & Fitness and JD certifications go to Toni Landis, Law Registrar: registrar@law.wisc.edu

Note: Official Transcripts must be ordered from the University Registrar (https://registrar.wisc.edu/transcript/)

Pro Bono Program

If you've done pro bono work during law school, you may be eligible for the Pro Bono Honor Society

- 50 / 100 hours
- Hours earned while in law school
- Log in Symplicity by April 12
- Subject to verification
- Indication in graduation program and chord

Remember to check:

- 1. Is your Excel reflective of your work to this point?
- 2. Is your Upper-Level Writing Requirement documentation submitted and confirmed?
- 3. Are your 6 credits of Experiential coursework confirmed?
- 4. Is your paperwork for non-law classes submitted?
- 5. Are you reading your email carefully for updates/information/requests from Law School administration?
- 6. Are you reading bar application directions carefully and following the steps as outlined?
